Monday	<p>This week's home learning focus is on VE day. There's a battle in place between Year 5 and 6 this week! It will finish at 4pm on Friday! <u>My Maths:</u> There are plenty of tasks on My Maths for you to complete. I'm checking the activities online myself and know that there are a number for you to choose from! <u>Activity:</u> Many people will be having a VE day style party or celebration on Friday. Can you plan a VE day party? You need to think about all the things you might need which include food, drinks and maybe accessories such as blankets and decorations!</p> <p><u>English:</u> <u>Reading:</u> Try to read some of your book every day. When you finish a book, complete a book review in your green book. <u>SPAG:</u> Use spag.com and choose a task that you would like to complete. <u>Writing:</u> Using your Topic research, can you write a diary entry imagining that you were someone who experienced VE day? It could be from the point of view of a child, soldier or even one of England's rulers.</p> <p><u>Topic:</u> History- What is VE day? Can you create a fact file or list or poster to explain what it is and why it is important?</p>
Tuesday	<p><u>Maths:</u> <u>TT Rockstars:</u> Try some daily rockstars. There's a battle in place between Year 5 and 6 this week! It will finish at 4pm on Friday! <u>My Maths:</u> There are plenty of tasks on My Maths for you to complete. <u>Activity:</u> Using your list from yesterday, can you find out and work out the cost of the items you need? You could set yourself a budget of £30 and see if you can spend less than that along with thinking about how much money you might have spare. This is similar to an activity that you completed before where you were able to use internet shopping sites to help you.</p> <p><u>English:</u></p>

	<p><u>Reading</u>: Try to read some of your book every day. When you finish a book, complete a book review in your green book.</p> <p><u>SPAG</u>: Use spag.com and choose a task that you would like to complete.</p> <p><u>Writing</u>: Write a newspaper report on VE day. This could be set in the past or could be written about present day celebrations. You can set it out on Purple Mash if you wish as I have set it as a '2do'.</p>
	<p><u>Topic</u>:</p> <p>PE- Learn some popular 1940's dance moves! The Lindy Hop is a dance that was performed and enjoyed during celebrations in the 1940's. Wednesday	<p><u>Maths</u>:</p> <p><u>TT Rockstars</u>: Try some daily rockstars. There's a battle in place between Year 5 and 6 this week! It will finish at 4pm on Friday!</p> <p><u>My Maths</u>: There are plenty of tasks on My Maths for you to complete.</p> <p><u>Activity</u>: Recipes were still created and followed during the war even when certain foods were rationed. Can you find a recipe online for a wartime recipe? You could try and make it if possible! If not, can you change the recipe (using ratio) to feed either more people or less people?</p>
	<p><u>English</u>:</p> <p><u>Reading</u>: Try to read some of your book every day. When you finish a book, complete a book review in your green book.</p> <p><u>SPAG</u>: Use spag.com and choose a task that you would like to complete.</p> <p><u>Writing</u>: Write a VE day themed poem. It could be an acrostic poem (the letters down one side which start each line) or one that makes you think about the sights and sounds that would have been heard.</p> <p><u>Topic</u>:</p> <p>Art- Create a VE day piece of art. This can be anything you choose. I've included a few ideas below but you may have ideas of your own!</p>
Thursday	<p><u>Maths</u>:</p> <p><u>TT Rockstars</u>: Try some daily rockstars. There's a battle in place between Year 5 and 6 this week! Such as what was the difference in the amounts between day 1 and the current day?</p> <p>You could also create a line graph showing the increase in his amounts.</p> <p><u>English</u>:</p>

	<p><u>Reading:</u> Try to read some of your book every day. When you finish a book, complete a book review in your green book.</p> <p><u>SPAG:</u> Use spag.com and choose a task that you would like to complete.</p> <p><u>Writing:</u> Captain Tom has been in the news recently and last week. For his 100th Birthday he was given the honorary title of ‘Colonel’ by the Queen. Could you write a letter to either Colonel Tom or a soldier or even someone who experienced WW2?</p> <p><u>Topic:</u> Who is Colonel Tom? Why has he become so well known recently? Can you write a biography about him?</p>
Friday	<p><u>Topic:</u> History- It’s VE day (Victory in Europe Day)! Using some of the items you have created this week, can you create either a mini video or powepoint or poster (or anything similar) to tell others all about it! You could also teach others your dance from this week! Have fun and include anything else that you may be doing- some of you may even be having picnics in your garden!</p> <p>At 11:15 on the British Legion website, there is a 45 minute livestream which could be very interesting to watch!</p>
