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Monday	<p><u>Maths:</u> <u>TT Rockstars:</u> Try some daily rockstars. Can you challenge other children to battles and can you improve your time and score? <u>My Maths:</u> There are plenty of tasks on My Maths for you to complete. I'm checking the activities online myself and know that there are a number for you to choose from! <u>Activity:</u> This week we are going to focus on shapes. Look for 2D shapes in the room around you (remember 2D are flat). What shapes can you see? Are there any shapes that are the same but for different objects? Can you either create a list or draw what you can see and label the shapes?</p>
	<p><u>English:</u> <u>Reading:</u> Try to read some of your book every day. When you finish a book, complete a book review in your green book. <u>SPAG:</u> Use spag.com and choose a task that you would like to complete. <u>Writing:</u> We are going to think about flashbacks in stories. Watch the following trailer: https://www.traileraddict.com/up/carl-and-ellie (You don't need to login or sign up). Can you create thought bubbles or a list on your opinions of the trailer? What do you like or dislike about it? Is it a good trailer that shows flashbacks or could improvements be made?</p>
	<p><u>Topic:</u> History- Our new topic is 'Oh I do like to be beside the seaside' What is a holiday to you? Why do people go on holiday? Where do people go on holiday? What activities do people like to do on holiday? You could think about holidays you've been on in the past or even ask your family or grandparents about the holidays they've been on!</p>
Tuesday	<p><u>Maths:</u> <u>TT Rockstars:</u> Try some daily rockstars. Can you challenge other children to battles and can you improve your time and score? <u>My Maths:</u> There are plenty of tasks on My Maths for you to complete. <u>Activity:</u> Today think about the 3D shapes that are around you (remember 3D shapes are not flat and are 3 dimensional). Like yesterday, Look for 3D shapes in the room around you. What shapes can you see? Are there any shapes that are the same but for different objects? Can you either create a list or draw what you can see and label the shapes? You could even use the kitchen and items that are in the kitchen as 3D objects.</p>
	<p><u>English:</u> <u>Reading:</u> Try to read some of your book every day. When you finish a book, complete a book review in your green book.</p>

	<p><u>SPAG:</u> Use spag.com and choose a task that you would like to complete.</p> <p><u>Writing:</u> Can you complete think, say and feel bubbles for a character from yesterday's trailer? Think about character inferences. What would he/she be feeling and why? What might he/she be thinking and why? What might he/she say and why?</p> <p><u>Topic:</u> Art-An artist called L.S.Lowry created a picture called 'At the seaside' which shows a busy beach scene. Drawing in the style of Lowry, can you create a beach scene that might show how it should look in the current situation. Think carefully about nature. All around us we are seeing more nature because there are less people around- so how would a beach look?</p>
Wednesday	<p><u>Maths:</u> <u>TT Rockstars:</u> Try some daily rockstars. Can you challenge other children to battles and can you improve your time and score? <u>My Maths:</u> There are plenty of tasks on My Maths for you to complete. <u>Activity:</u> When 3D shapes are built, they are built from a net. Open up some 3D shapes from around the house and see what they look like before they are built. Items like cereal boxes are made from nets. Are any shapes made with different nets? For example, are all cuboids made in the same way? Explore the nets around you. You can draw the nets if you wish.</p> <p><u>English:</u> <u>Reading:</u> Try to read some of your book every day. When you finish a book, complete a book review in your green book. <u>SPAG:</u> Use spag.com and choose a task that you would like to complete. <u>Writing:</u> Again, using the trailer from Up from Monday, think about the events of the trailer and the characters. Using PE (Point, Evidence), make inferences (what is implied/what conclusions you can come to) about the trailer/characters and events.</p> <p><u>Topic:</u> Geography- Can you either interactively use a map of Lancashire or print one off if possible to locate different places? Think about the places you have visited and maybe the locations of the homes of family members. Find the locations on the map and circle them or draw arrows to them and label them. I would like you to include the location where you live along with Sabden if it's different and I would like you to include Blackpool on your map too.</p>
Thursday	<p><u>Maths:</u> <u>TT Rockstars:</u> Try some daily rockstars. Can you challenge other children to battles and can you improve your time and score? <u>My Maths:</u> There are plenty of tasks on My Maths for you to complete. <u>Activity:</u> I have set you a learning task on My Maths called 'Nets of 3D shapes' and added a description that it is a home learning task.</p> <p><u>English:</u> <u>Reading:</u> Try to read some of your book every day. When you finish a book, complete a book review in your green book. <u>SPAG:</u> Use spag.com and choose a task that you would like to complete. <u>Writing:</u> Retell the story of the trailer. Write about what happens. Think about writing from the viewpoint of someone watching the trailer rather than being one of the characters.</p> <p><u>Topic:</u></p>

	Computing- I have set two coding tasks for you on Purple Mash. They are called 'Vehicles' and 'Turtle'.
Friday	<p><u>Maths:</u> <u>TT Rockstars:</u> Try some daily rockstars. Can you challenge other children to battles and can you improve your time and score? <u>My Maths:</u> There are plenty of tasks on My Maths for you to complete. <u>Activity:</u> I have set a 2do on Purple Mash called '3D Shapes' for you to complete. There is also a challenge/extension task set for Year 6 on My Maths called 'Plans elevation'...be warned that parts of it are rather tricky!</p>
	<p><u>English:</u> <u>Reading:</u> Try to read some of your book every day. When you finish a book, complete a book review in your green book. <u>SPAG:</u> Use spag.com and choose a task that you would like to complete. <u>Writing:</u> Can you write an alternative ending for the trailer? If you were in charge of writing the script for the film, what would you change and why?</p>
	<p><u>Topic:</u> RE- Jesus appeared to his disciples on a number of occasions after the Resurrection. He greeted them, shared food with them and then he sent them out to continue the message of the Good News. Luke tells how, after his Resurrection, Jesus reassures his disciples that they will not be alone. <i>Then Jesus said to them "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you – that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, the prophets and the psalms must be fulfilled". Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures and he said to them, "Thus it is written that the Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to these things. And see, I am sending upon you what my Father promised; so, stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high."</i> Luke 24: 44-49</p> <p>In Matthew, Jesus is not only reassuring the disciples but telling of their future mission.</p> <p><i>The eleven disciples went to the hill in Galilee where Jesus had told them to go. When they saw him, they worshipped him even though some of them doubted. Jesus drew near and said to them, "I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. Go then to all peoples everywhere and make them my disciples. Baptise them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit and teach them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And I will be with you always to the end of the age."</i> Matthew 28: 16-20</p> <p>Can you write a diary entry imagining that you are one of Jesus' disciples? Think about the events and what happened along with how you would be feeling.</p>

Extra Learning

I have set up a class login for the Oxford Owl website. <https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk>

Click on Oxford Owl for home. At the top left, you will see a 'My Class Login' sign/part. The class name is: fabulousclass3 and the password is: HarryPotter

Everyone in Class 3 will share the same login and can choose different eBooks to read at home. There are links with home reading books and the website just provides another opportunity for you to keep reading at home!

As a school, we do not follow White Rose Maths as a maths scheme. However, due to the current situation, the company has released some home learning packages on their website for free.
