	RE: Before Jesus returned to his Father, he promised his disciples that he would send them the Holy Spirit to enable them to continue
	to spread the Easter message and be his witnesses.
	In the Acts of the Apostles account of what happened after the Resurrection; the writer describes Jesus' return to his Father in
	symbolic language.
	So, when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" He
	replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power
	when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judaea and Samaria, and to the
	ends of the earth."
	When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going
	and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do
	you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as
	you saw him go into heaven."
	Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a Sabbath day's journey away. When
	they had entered the city, they went to the room upstairs where they were staying, Peter, John, James, Andrew, Philip and

	The disciples, Mary and the women gathered together in Jerusalem to wait in prayer in the upper room for the coming of the Holy Spirit. It was coming up to the Jewish feast of Pentecost or Shavuot, that is the harvest festival. There were many people in Jerusalem at this time.
	Describe the conversation which took place among the people in that upper room. Include any reference they would have made to the scriptures and the saying of Jesus. (Do not forget that the Gospels have not yet been written but they would be very familiar with the words of Jesus.) How would they describe their own beliefs, feelings. and experiences and how would they have made links between them? Record this in any way you wish.
